




DJ Workshop with Noise Academy

Behaviour and Rewards Workshop Feedback



This half term we introduced a new classroom code of conduct and rewards scheme across SILS 3 and SILS 4. It was very important to us that we shared these updates with our students directly, and created an open forum for them to share their thoughts on these changes.

What our students said:

Rewards

Students feel that more positive phone calls and certificates, trips and rewards based on individuals effort and group efforts are a good thing.

They feel we should take responsibility for recording positive behaviour, however we do need reminding sometimes.

It is important that rewards are the same across all subjects and teachers. We need to know what to expect throughout the day.

Code of Conduct

We like the colour coding on the behaviour document and understand that the colours signify severity of behaviour.

The document is quite wordy and doesn't cover every scenario, this could lead to confusion.

We could change the language to make it more student voice influenced.

We need to be reminded regularly and prompted to focus our behaviour, reminders give us a chance to address our behaviour.

Staff responses need to be the same in every class, we want to be heard and treated fairly.
